Silver Shades Of Grey: Memos for Successful Ageing In The 21st Century is a densely researched tome let down by patchy organisation.

Its author, orthopaedic surgeon Kanwaljit Soin, has assembled an army of facts and figures covering the vast terrain of ageing, including how a person who is 50 may have a fitness age of 35 or 75; or how, contrary to stereotypes, older people may be less afraid of crime than younger people.

One stumbles across such intriguing nuggets amid worthy but unexcitingly written paragraphs describing studies and phenomena related to ageing.

This suggests the book could have done with tighter editing so readers can navigate it more easily.

Take, for instance, the pleasingly homonymic buzzword "whealth", a fusion of wealth and

The portmanteau alludes to how secure finances and good health can be mutually reinforcing.



But this potentially interesting point - with implications for those with lower incomes and poor health - is mentioned only in the last paragraph of a chapter blandly titled Age, Wealth And Health, which opens with the bromide, "Why is there concern about population ageing?"

The implications of concepts such as "whealth" deserve to be shaken out and brought into the light, like fusty fabrics with rich colours that are finally uncovered.

Dr Soin mentions her 96-year-old mother who had dementia in a moving paragraph, a personal fact notable for its lack of reappearance in the book.

While Silver Shades Of Grey is to be applauded for its encyclopaedic knowledge about ageing,

perhaps it could have been leavened with other similarly personal accounts, either by its author or by other voices buffeted by the vicissitudes of ageing.
